Peter's Pastoral Year

A couple weekends ago, our seminarian Peter Fazzari introduced himself at the end of all of the Masses. Peter is in the midst of four years of major seminary studying theology. He finished his undergraduate degree at Gonzaga University and did his philosophy while going through his years of minor seminary at Bishop White Seminary here in Spokane.

What does all of this mean? How long exactly does it take to get through seminary and get ordained?

A man's seminary journey typically takes eight years. Four years are college, four years are major seminary, or what we might think of as "graduate school." In college, a man needs a certain number of classes and credits in philosophy, as required by the Vatican and the American bishops. A man might already have a college degree and then decides to enter seminary; in that case, he will require two years of minor seminary in order to obtain all of the philosophy requirements. Such a man thus will have had four years of college plus two years of philosophy; his own seminary journey will actually be longer than most.

After completing philosophy and earning his college degree, a man in seminary moves on to major seminary, where he will study theology. The Diocese of Spokane currently sends men to one of two schools for major seminary: St. Patrick in Menlo Park in California (where Bishop Thomas Daly is on the board of directors and where at least one of our Spokane priests is on faculty); and Theological College in Washington, DC, at the Catholic University of America. Peter is currently enrolled at the latter. A man in his third year of major seminary typically is ordained deacon at the end of his third year, and his final year of seminary concludes with his ordination to the priesthood.

Many men will take time away from his studies – but is still a seminarian – and go on what is called a "pastoral year." This is something like an internship. He will live with a priest, more or less live the life of a priest, shadow his assigned pastor, observe what he does and how he does it, and so on. He will often be given his own tasks to accomplish and some measure of freedom to devise his own projects from his own ideas, thereby encouraging his pastoral creativity for faith formation projects and other things.

In the Diocese of Spokane, Bishop Daly seems to be adjusting our seminary formation program such that a pastoral year is actually required for all men in seminary and is built into the overall program, and Peter is at the front-edge of that adjustment. The biggest help we can offer Peter during his pastoral year is prayer. This is a very crucial stage in his discernment and formation, and prayers for him will be so important as he begins his year with us and continues his seminary journey.
