The Lourdes Novena

The Diocese of Spokane is presenting the annual "Lourdes Novena for Healing" from February 3rd through February 11th at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Lourdes. Bishop Thomas Daly will begin the Novena with a special sermon entitled "The Miracle of Lourdes". Evening services last 45 minutes and will include prayers for healing, Marian Anthems sung by the Diocesan Children's choir, Benediction, and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Icon: The Ascension of Our Lord VII

The figure of the Ascended Christ is contained in a shape referred to as a mandorla. This symbolizes the heavenly realm. Mandorla is related to the word meaning almond. Hence, the almond shape. Behind the figure of Christ is an area that is dark and called the uncreated light. The light is so bright that the human eye cannot see it. Thus, it appears dark. Christ is traditionally shown seated upon a rainbow. In the icon the rainbow is reflected in the surrounding angels. Christ Himself is enrobed in a golden garment which symbolizes light and royal dignity. His face is patterned on the image from the *Shroud of Turin*. He holds in His hand a vellum scroll, symbolizing the Word written upon the flesh. The red cord indicates His human descent and His divinity enwrapped in humanity. Within the Lord's halo you see the cruciform which is unique to Christ. His name is written in Greek letters abbreviated, meaning Jesus Christ.
