Lenten Regulations: Fasting and Abstinence

Remember the Church's simple formula for observing Lent: almsgiving, prayer and fasting. These are the three things that we do to strengthen our relationship with the Lord and prepare for Easter.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence from meat for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

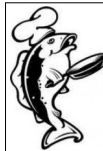
Friday Stations of the Cross, Reconciliation and Soup Supper
